Animal Protector Levels – This level helps provide care for illness and minor surgery.

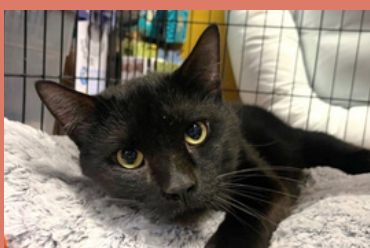
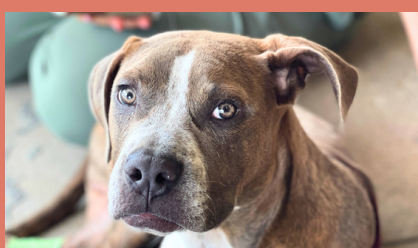
- Furry Friends - \$150 (or \$15/month)

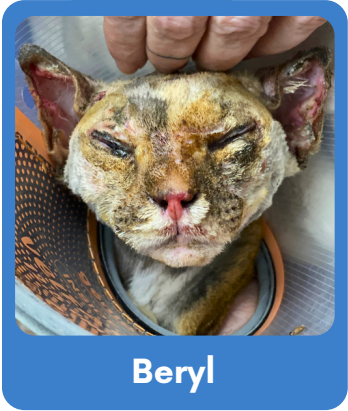


did you know?



Animal Aid of Tulsa's (AAT) average cost per animal is \$2,400. Many animals are able to be treated for less but others, especially those with complicated fractures requiring orthopedic surgery, can top \$5,000 or more. Although that expense is high, once AAT commits to an animal, we do whatever it takes to help them recover and find a loving home.

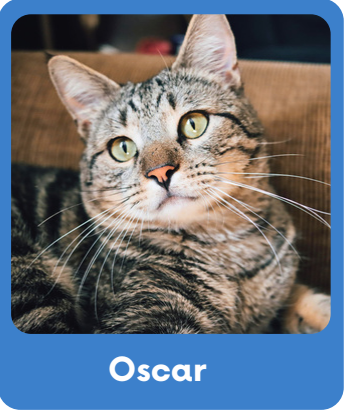
Due to the nature of the animals AAT rescues, many of our cats and dogs require emergency care to save their lives. An initial trip to an emergency vet can cost hundreds to thousands of dollars. Dogs and cats that have been hit by cars or received other traumatic injuries often have complicated leg fractures, broken pelvises, or damage to internal organs. Other animals arrive with gunshot wounds, severe infections, old bullets embedded in their bodies, or covered in scars from dog-fighting. Some simply have been abandoned and left to fend for themselves while struggling to survive. These conditions are typically survivable but become deadly due to treatment cost and the inability to find help. That is where Animal Aid steps in to help these animals get the care needed to save their lives and support them as they regain their health and find a happy home.



Beryl
Treated for: severe burns and thermal injuries. Will likely need eye surgery.
- treatment cost \$9,433+



Emery
Treated for: fractured pelvis, dislocated hip, lung contusions.
- treatment cost \$7,437



Oscar
Treated for: deep, infected wounds from coyote attack.
- treatment cost \$2,848



Cordelia
Treated for: pulmonary contusions, pneumothorax, fractured femur.
- treatment cost \$8,217+



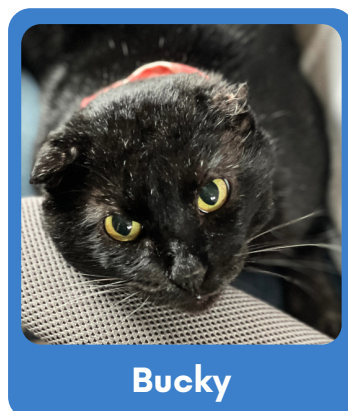
Johnny & June
Treated for: pneumonia at 10 weeks old with 50/50 chance of survival.
- treatment cost \$5,753



Lazarus
Treated for: fractured femur, head trauma, breathing & vision issues
- treatment cost \$8,579



Briar
Treated for: blood loss from intestinal parasites, severe dehydration, hypothermia.
- treatment cost \$4,840



Bucky
Treated for: chronic ear trauma, various wounds & lacerations, "dead" toe
- treatment cost \$3,415

Animal Aid frequently receives urgent requests from community members who see animals hit by cars or laying on the side of the road with life-threatening injuries.
