Annual Membership Levels & Benefits

did you know?



Animal Aid of Tulsa's (AAT) average cost per animal is \$2,400. Many animals are able to be treated for less but others, especially those with complicated fractures requiring orthopedic surgery, can top \$5,000 or more. Although that expense is high, once AAT commits to an animal, we do whatever it takes to help them recover and find a loving home.



Treated for: severe mastitis that abscessed and ruptured, and resulting infection - treatment cost \$6,589



Treated for: pelvic fractures requiring surgery and extended recovery time treatment cost \$7,220



Treated for: degloved jaw and various other injuries - treatment cost \$3,778

Due to the nature of the animals AAT rescues, many of our cats and dogs require emergency care to save their lives. An initial trip to an emergency vet can cost anywhere from several hundred to thousands of dollars. Dogs and cats that have been hit by cars or received other traumatic injuries often have complicated leg fractures, broken pelvises, or damage to internal organs. These are typically survivable injuries that become deadly due to treatment cost and the inability to find help. That is where Animal Aid steps in to help these animals get the urgent care needed to save their lives and support them as they regain their health and find a happy home.

Animal Aid frequently receives urgent requests from community members who see animals hit by cars or laying on the side of the road with life-threatening injuries. Or an animal struggling to survive, and showing signs of serious illness, that needs immediate treatment. Many animal welfare organizations are unable to help in these cases because of the cost. However, for someone who finds a stray cat or dog needing emergency care, it is frustrating and heartbreaking to see them suffer and search for help in vain.

The number of sick and injured cats and dogs that need help often seems limitless. And although Animal Aid can't save them all, each new intake means one less animal suffering without care or being needlessly euthanized.
